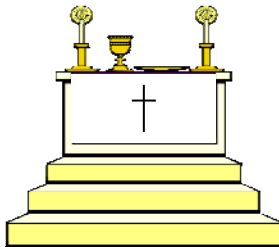

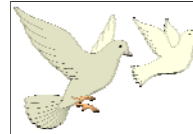

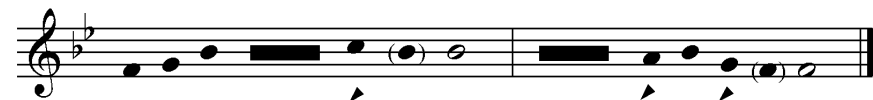
**The Episcopal Ministries of LI Annual Appeal

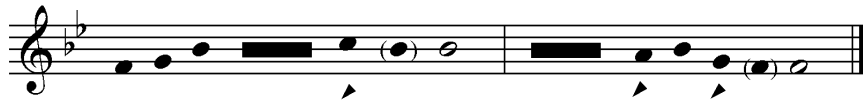
