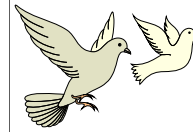

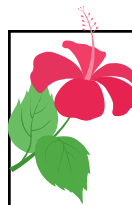
The Watch

Gethsemane

*Then Jesus went with his disciples to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to them, Sit here while I go over there and pray. He took Peter and the two sons of Zebedee along with him, and he began to be sorrowful and troubled. Then he said to them, My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me. Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will." Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. **Could you men not keep watch with me for one hour?**" he asked Peter. Mothering Sunday



Today, on this fourth Sunday in Lent, we celebrate Mothering Sunday, as an Anglican Church. The history of Mothering Sunday in the UK is rather interesting with one theory that the celebration could have been adopted in Neolithic times from a Roman Spring festival celebrating Cybele, their Mother Goddess. Most Sundays in the year churchgoers in England worship at their nearest parish or 'daughter church'. Centuries ago it was considered important for people to return to their home or 'mother' church once a year. So each year in the middle of Lent, everyone would visit their 'mother' church - the main church or Cathedral of the area. The service would be in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary. People who visited their mother church, would say they had gone "a mothering." Inevitably the return to the 'mother' church became an occasion for family reunions when children who were working away returned home. (It was quite common in those days for children to leave home for work once they were ten years old.) And most historians think that it was the return to the 'Mother' church which led to the tradition of children, particularly those working as domestic servants, or as apprentices, being given the day off to visit their mother and family. As they walked along the country lanes, children would pick wild flowers or violets to take to church or give to their mother as a small gift.

Mothering Sunday was also known as 'Refreshment Sunday', Pudding Pie Sunday (in Surrey, England), Rose Sunday or Laetare Sunday as it was witnessed by the purple robes of Lent being replaced in some churches by rose-colored ones, Simnel Sunday because of the tradition of baking Simnel cakes, or 'Mid-Lent Sunday'. It was a day in Lent when the fasting rules were relaxed, in honor of the 'Feeding of the Five Thousand'. Today, Mothering Sunday is a day when children give presents, flowers, and home-made cards to their mothers to express their love.



Maintaining Quiet Reflection:

One of the joys of entering a sanctuary of Our Savior is that the environment is conducive to prayer and worship preparation. As you enter the sanctuary of Caroline Church on Sunday mornings, please be cognizant that others in the pews are preparing themselves to worship Our Lord. Any unnecessary talking should be avoided.
